

Micro Wolf Cripple:

Hook: TMC 2487BL, Size 16, 18, 20

Thread: Ultra 70, Black

Shuck: May Fly Brown Zelon

Body: Peacock Herl, 2-3 strands, depending on  
size of hook

Thorax: Peacock Herl

Wing: White Zelon

Hackle: Grizzly

Begin by putting the hook in your vice. Start wrapping the thread just behind the eye of the hook and continue to just past the bend of the hook. Tie in the shuck material, trimming to  $\frac{1}{2}$  the hook shank. Tie in the peacock herl at the bend, wrapping it around the thread for strength, and wrap forward to a point  $\frac{2}{3}$  of the hook shank. Tie off but don't trim. Take your wing material and tie it on so that it lays a good  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch past the hook eye. Tie off, taking several turns of thread in front of the eye to stand it up, still allowing it to lean some. Now trim the back portion of the Zelon, leaving a stub to stick out. Tie in a hackle feather and proceed to wrap the herl through the space created by the stub and wing. Tie off and trim excess. Now wrap your hackle forward, allowing for 2-3 wraps behind the wing and one in front. Trim and tie off. Cement the head of the fly.
